


Dear Reader,

On May 25, 2018, GDPR came into force — Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation). This is a revolution in the protection of personal data that introduces the most important changes:

Bigger Responsibility, Bigger Repercussions



DATA SUBJECT'S RIGHTS:

- extended right to information, the right to be forgotten
- the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority
- only the necessary data contained in the Registration Card can be processed
- the Reader may withdraw his/her consent at any time
- the right to be forgotten the right to immediately delete a person's data on his/her demand
